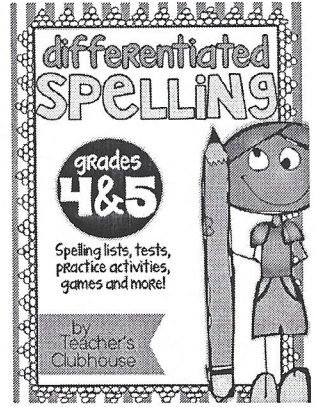

1. **slough**- n. a place full of soft, deep mud; a bog or marsh
2. **drifts**- n. a bank or pile, as of sand or snow, heaped up by currents of air or water
3. **chattering**- v. making a rattling noise
4. **clattering**- v. rapid and repeating sounds made by objects hitting one another
5. **uneasy** - adj. worried
6. **cross** – adj. angry
7. **startled** - v. surprised or alarmed
8. **pale**- adj. light in color; having coloring closer to white than is usual normal
9. **steady**- adj. not nervous or excited
10. **stump**- n. the part of a tree that remains in the ground after the tree is cut down
11. **prairie**- n. a large, mostly flat area of land in North America that has few trees and is covered in grasses
12. **squinting**- v. formed from squint; having to look at something with your eyes partly closed
13. **staring**- v. form of stare; to look at someone or something for a long time, often with your eyes wide open
